

## **ABC UPDATE 12/21/2015**

President Barack Obama recently <u>signed</u> he FY2016 Omnibus Bill, giving the National Institutes of Health a much needed boost of \$2 billion in the fiscal year 2016 budget. The NIH also <u>unveiled</u> its <u>NIH-Wide Strategic Plan</u>, <u>Fiscal Years 2016-2020</u>: <u>Turning Discovery Into Health</u>.

Here is more news from the world of science advocacy:

## **SCIENCE ADVOCACY NEWS**

- An <u>update</u> on the Precision Medicine Initiative was recently presented. The NIH also released a <u>request for information</u> to identify a system(s) for conducting a physical evaluation and collecting specimens from Direct Volunteers for the PMI Cohort Program.
- Rep. Tom Cole (R-Okla.) the Chair of the House Appropriations Subcommittee on Labor, Health and Human Services spent the last year <u>meeting</u> with medical research and public health experts to become more acquainted with such issues.
- The Study Committee on Human Gene Editing will meet in Feb 2016 to discuss the scientific, social and ethical underpinnings of human gene-editing technologies. The last such meeting was held in December 2015.
- The Institute for Patient Access (IfPA) released a policy briefing entitled The Value of Human Milk Diets for Premature Infants. Read here for more details.

## IN THE NEWS

- A recent study <u>showed</u> that poverty may slightly increase childhood risk of neurological impairment.
- Another NIH-funded study <u>showed</u> that multiple biological pathways can lead to similar symptoms of psychosis; and yet showed that speeding up brain's waste disposal by proteasomes may slow down neurodegenerative diseases.
- The NIH hosted a meeting for scientists involved in the BRAIN initiative in December 2015.
- <u>BIO</u> and Parent Project Muscular Dystrophy (PPMD) <u>launched</u> an initiative to share best practices on patient preference studies.
- BIO recently <u>released</u> infographics to highlight the value of biopharmaceutical innovation, including the impact on Alzheimer's disease, cancer, and HIV/AIDS.
