- Neurologists from the <u>American Academy of Neurology</u> testified at the House Concussion Roundtable and shared new information about concussion.
- Representatives from the <u>American Academy of Neurology</u> talked to the chair of the Health Subcommittee about the Medicare Access and CHIP Reauthorization (<u>MACRA</u>) Act that covers a new physician reimbursement system.
- The NIH will <u>review</u> its policies on all nonhuman primate research this summer.
