SCIENCE ADVOCACY NEWS

- Rep. Ted Lieu (D-CA) and Rep. Thomas MacArthur (R-NJ) have joined the <u>Congressional Caucus on Parkinson's Disease</u>, which supports the policy needs of the Parkinson's community by introducing Parkinson's-specific legislation, supporting federal funding for Parkinson's research, and championing other legislative priorities.
- A package of bills focused on biomedical innovations, including S. 849, the Advancing Research for Neurological Diseases Act, is expected to make its way to the Senate floor for a full vote in the coming weeks.

IN THE NEWS

- The International Bipolar Foundation (<u>IBPF</u>) will be awarded the <u>Child Mind Institute's</u> Outstanding Organization Change Maker Award. This award is presented to a nonprofit organization that has worked to transform the way mental health is viewed in their community.
- Study investigators from One Mind recently met with the FDA to accelerate the approval process for biomarkers for traumatic brain injury (TBI). These efforts will pave the way for new treatments for TBI.
- There is a recent article and a Letter to the Editor in the New York Times about increase in suicide rates.
- Research shows that aerobic exercise and meditation may help <u>alleviate depression</u>. Another <u>study</u> showed the beneficial effects of exercise on the brain.
- Another study in mice <u>showed</u> that ketamine might be useful in treating depressive symptoms after alcohol withdrawal.
- In the coming days, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) is expected to make an official ruling on Nuplazid, a drug for Parkinson's disease psychosis. The Parkinson's Action Network submitted a Letter in its support.
