SCIENCE ADVOCACY NEWS

- The Senate Appropriations Labor-HHS Subcommittee marked up their <u>bil</u> on Tuesday, agreeing to move the bill to full committee without objection. Included in this bill is \$250 mil for activities related to the <u>BRAIN</u> Initiative.
- The House Energy and Commerce Committee, chaired by Rep. Fred Upton (R-MI), has scheduled a full committee <u>markup</u> on Wednesday, June 15, 2016, to consider several bills including landmark mental health legislation. Details on the time and location will be <u>posted</u> as they become available.
- The White House Domestic Policy Council released a <u>progress report</u> on actions taken by the Administration since 2009 to improve mental health research, access to care, and treatment. The VA has released a comprehensive interagency <u>fact sheet</u> today on actions taken to improve access to mental health care for veterans.
- The American Brain Tumor Association is <u>working</u> to enure that brain tumor research is included in federal funding.
- Congress <u>continues</u> oversight hearings on Part B, Concussions, MACRA (Medicare Access and CHIP Reauthorization Act of 2015).

- NIH researchers <u>explore</u> how to stay healthier for longer.
- Another study <u>reported</u> that blood markers indicate high levels of inflammation in people with schizophrenia, bipolar disorder and depression.
- Studies have <u>found</u> that some autism-like behaviors disappear in adult mice after switching on the Shank3 Gene.
- In the field of Alzheimer's Disease, a study found that tau protein can predict early memory loss in Alzheimer's.
- The NIAAA has selected winners of its Wearable Alcohol Biosensor Challenge.

- A new genetic study reveals pathways that may be disrupted in people with OCD.
- A study in mice <u>showed</u> that anti-inflammatory medications may help prevent some mental illness with a causal link to immune activation in fetal period.

- An NIH-funded <u>study</u> found that prevention may be essential to reducing racial disparities in stroke. This study provides clues to differences in stroke deaths between blacks and whites.



- Marijuana and Cannabinoids: A Neuroscience Research Summit was held at the National Institutes of Health in March 2016. The Summit presented evidence-based information on the neurological and psychiatric effects of marijuana, other cannabinoids, and the endocannabinoid system.
